

<p>EXPLORING DOUBLES</p> <p>Find different ways to build doubles. You can use objects you have at home, find examples of doubles in the environment or draw some.</p> 	<p>SPEAKING AND LISTENING -</p> <p>The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle. You may have a version at home if not there are plenty online. Listen to the story.</p> <p>Discuss the story with a family member. What were the main events? What did the caterpillar eat? How did the story start? How did it end?</p> <p>Consider how you could change part of the story – maybe change the food that the caterpillar ate each day.</p>
<p>DOUBLING BUTTERFLIES</p> <p>Draw some butterflies. Draw some dots or write a number on one wing. Draw the same number of dots or number on the other wing. How many is this altogether?</p> <p>Challenge: write the doubles from double 1 to double 10. Do you notice a pattern?</p>	<p>PHONICS</p> <p>YR: oo(as in moon) oo (as in book) ar or</p> <p>Y1: Phase 5c –igh sounds There are lots of ways to spell this sound and not all of them with the letter ‘i’ Look at the text in Phonics Play Phoneme Spotter: https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/5/alt-spellings-igh Make yourself a bookmark with the different ‘i’ sounds on it. The next time you read, keep your eyes open for words like these.</p>

Choose your favourite and write a book review. Include the following Title What the story was about Why you liked it.</p>
<p>DAYS OF THE WEEK</p> <p>Cut out and order days of the week. Keep a diary this week, writing about something you do each day. Write your own version of The Very Hungry Caterpillar changing part of the story. Remember to use the pattern On Monday But he was still hungry. Write a sentence for each day of the week – remember how to spell each day correctly (This was last week’s spelling task)</p>
<p>SYMMETRY</p> <p>Explore what is meant by symmetry – when something is exactly the same on both sides when split in half. Look at some examples of butterflies – this might be in books or on the internet. Are they symmetrical? Create your own symmetrical butterfly either by drawing or painting on one side of a piece of paper then folding in half to print the other side.</p> <p>For an extra challenge – use a small mirror to explore objects or other natural things to find out if they’re symmetrical</p> 	<p>NON FICTION</p> <p>Find out more about the author of The Hungry Caterpillar, Eric Carle. Do you know of any other books he has written?</p>  <p>How many of these have you read? Which ones are also about minibeasts? Create a poster or information booklet about Eric Carle and some of his other books.</p> <p>For an extra challenge write a blurb for one of the books.</p>

What are the different stages? <p>PSHE – FEELINGS (Using the attached sheet of pictures) Look at the pictures and write down words to describe how the person is feeling. Choose a picture from the How are you feeling? sheet that shows the best feeling to have when they are learning something new and difficult. Explain why you think this is the case. Discuss being angry or being worried and what we can do to become relaxed. Draw pictures or make a poster to show all the different ways you can relax. This might be looking at a book, playing with a favourite toy, resting on the sofa, stroking a pet etc.</p>	<p>MUSIC Have a go at learning these songs. Mix and blend these fruits (or a selection of others) together to make a smoothie.</p>  <p>If you prefer you could make a fruit salad. Practise peeling, chopping, mixing and serving. Which fruit did you like best and why?
